Sunday Gospel John 14:1-12



Jesus said to his disciples:

‘Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me. There are many rooms in my Father’s house; if there were not, I should have told you.

I am going now to prepare a place for you, and after I have gone and prepared you a place, I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too.

You know the way to the place where I am going.’

Thomas said, ‘Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?’

Jesus said: ‘I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one can come to the Father except through me. If you know me, you know my Father too. From this moment you know him and have seen him.’

Philip said, ‘Lord, let us see the Father and then we shall be satisfied.’ ‘Have I been with you all this time, Philip,’ said Jesus to him ‘and you still do not know me?

‘To have seen me is to have seen the Father, so how can you say, “Let us see the Father”?’

Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak as from myself: it is the Father, living in me, who is doing this work. You must believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; believe it on the evidence of this work, if for no other reason. I tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father.’

Sunday Space



This Sunday's gospel again had Jesus reassuring his friends that he will guide them even when they can't see him. John's gospel spends quite a bit of time over this sense of friendship and we see that Jesus' friends don't have as much confidence in him as you would think. One of the reasons people believe in the gospels is this sense that the writers are happy to be seen as failures, as doubters and people who ask questions. I suppose the point is that if we knew everything then we wouldn't need God and it is our honest 'I'm not sure' that actually helps us get to know Jesus better. I'm sure you have a lot of questions you would like to ask Jesus about our current situation. Maybe take a bit of quiet time to share those questions with him and ask him to show you a 'way' to deal with them.

There is a workbook on the Gospel attached – some of it may be a little young for you but maybe to share with siblings or the family. There's a good activity about blessing the rooms in your house which you might like to try. Also a guide for saying the Rosary including some prayers from Pope Francis.

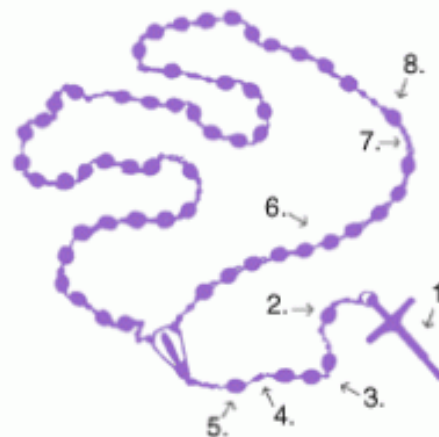
Pray the Rosary

In May we traditionally think about Mary, Jesus' mother, and how she guides us to talk to and listen to her son. We often make a point of saying the Rosary during May as this gives us time to sit with Mary and Jesus in prayer. The Rosary is a wonderful prayer if you are anxious or unable to sleep. Many people think of it as a way of making time for God. The diagram below is a very simple way of praying the Rosary – you can add readings from scripture and other prayers but this heartfelt repetition is just as good and you can place the name of a person or situation before you begin to pray. Saying the Rosary with someone else is also very meaningful- perhaps you could say it over social media with one of your relatives? If you don't have a rosary you can use your fingers or beads, marbles or pebbles. Here is a video of how to pray the rosary – and to pray along – from St Nicholas' Church in Hereford.

How to Pray the Rosary



1. Make the Sign of the Cross and pray the Apostles' Creed.
2. Pray the Our Father.
3. Pray three Hail Marys.
4. Pray Glory Be to the Father.
5. Announce the mystery for reflection and pray the Our Father.
6. Pray the 10 Hail Marys.
7. Finish the decade with the Glory Be to the Father.

Mindful Monday

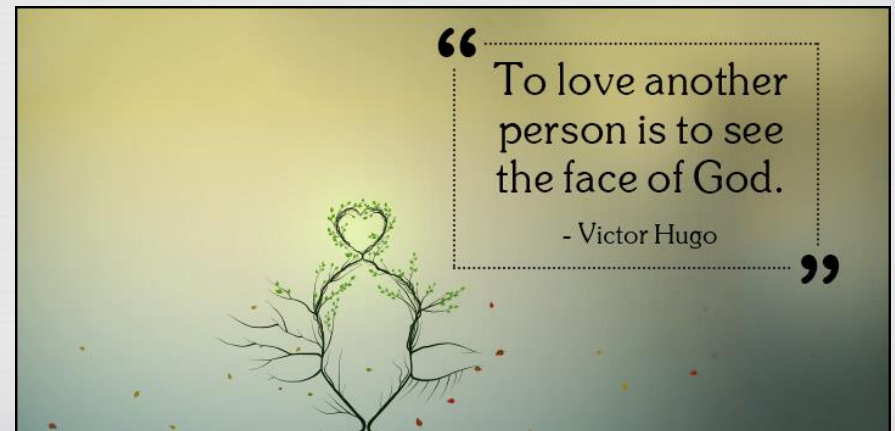


At the start of the week, we begin with a sense of knowing that where we are is maybe not where we are meant to be.

We are surrounded by good fortune. Take a moment to count your blessings.

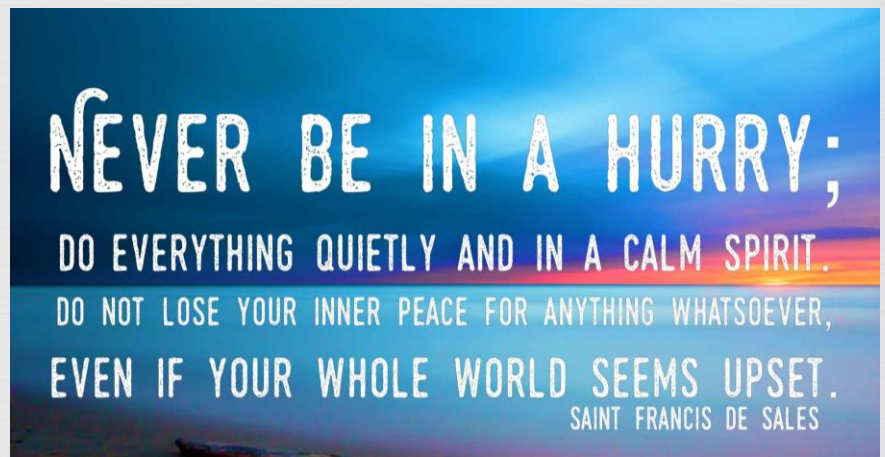

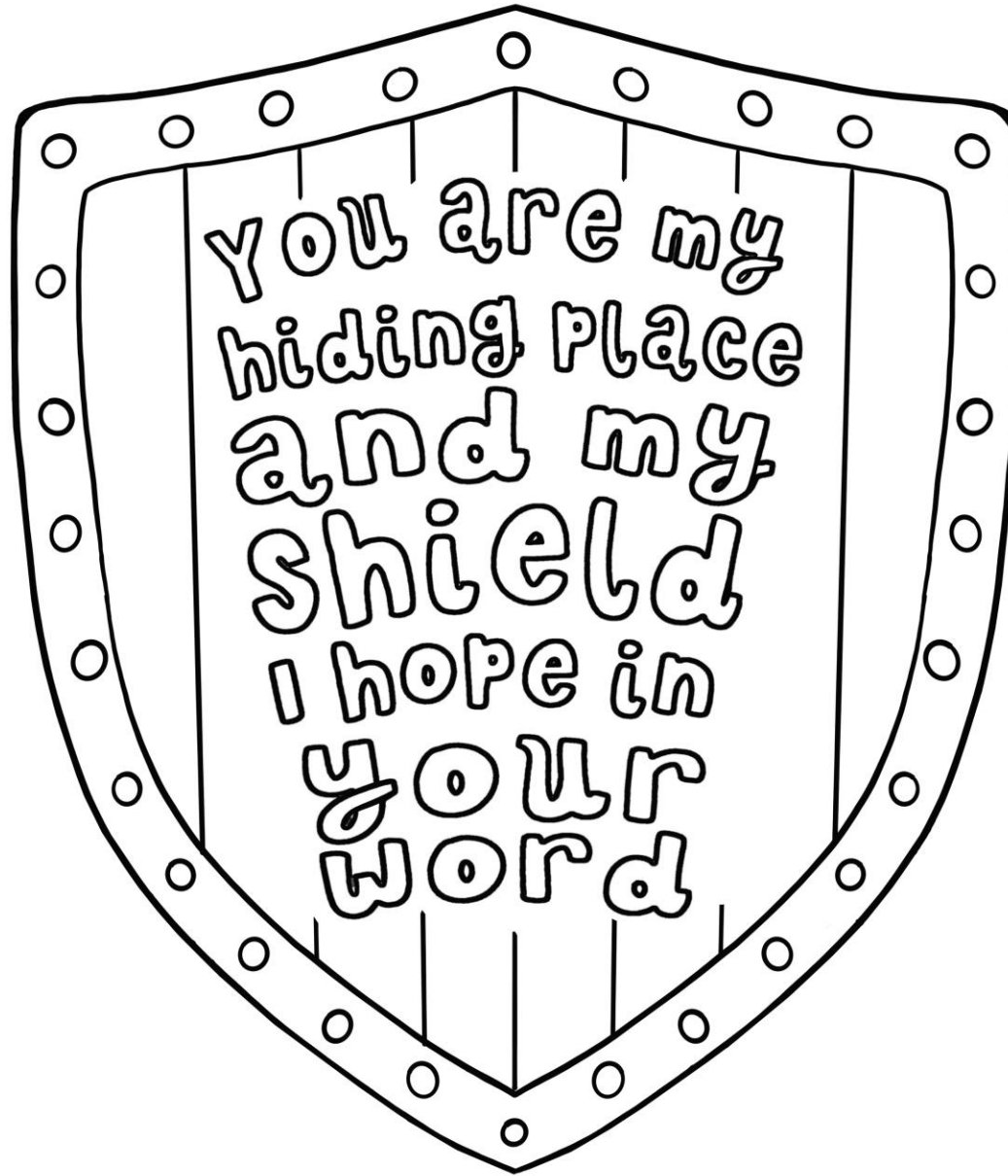

Fabulous Friday



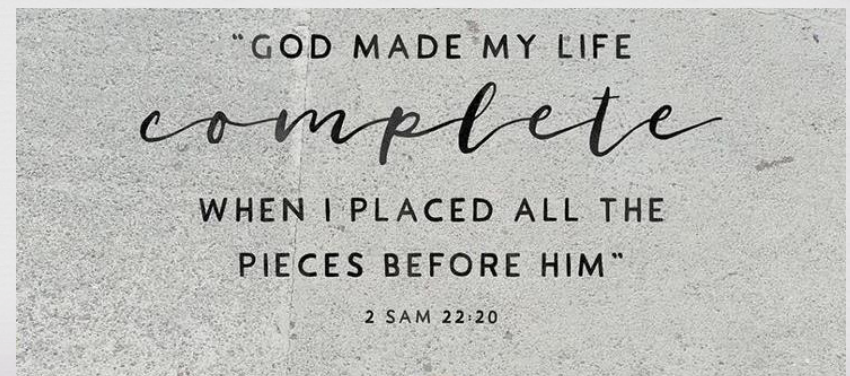

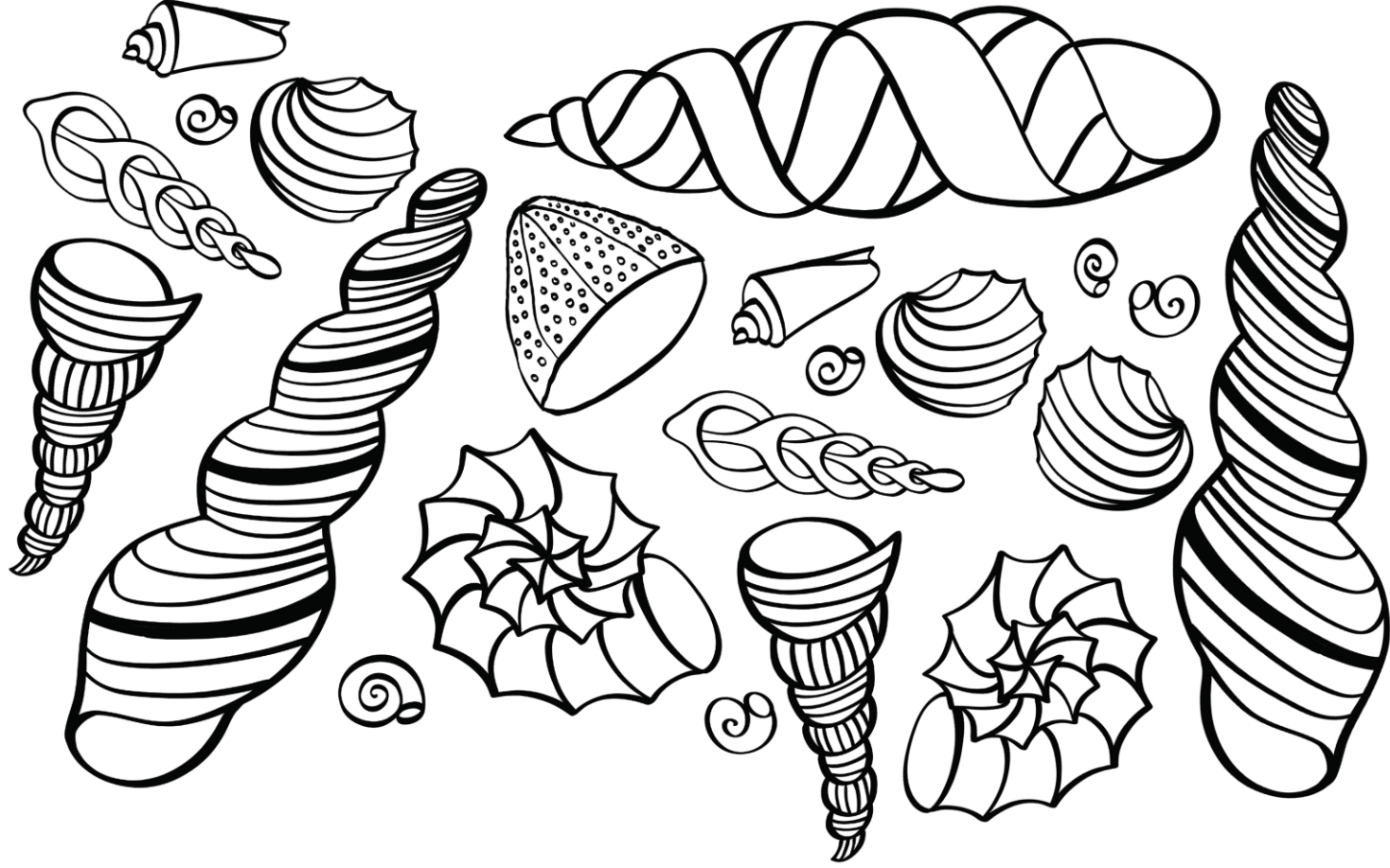
